
What does this position mean to you, career-wise (1 sentence what, 1 sentence why)? It is a great opportunity to experience some board work, which will likely be relevant in the future

Most of my peers have no idea about the whistle-blower function and don't know how to report harassment and discrimination if they occur, I am really motivated to change that. Sasse must take harassments seriously to ensure safety of every student.

Secondly, I'd make sure that the **budget becomes more transparent**, and the members of the organisation would be able to give feedback on it. Alumni will get an opportunity to contribute to sasse's development financially. Let's say you graduate and decide to contribute to your favourite committee or project – I will make that possible.

Thirdly, I'd work on **increasing diversity** within sasse committees and their boards, as currently many of them have no international students. Presence of international students in the boards would make the organisation more diverse, those who don't speak Swedish would feel more included. I would make sure that the interviews for sasse roles are held fairly and equally for all students.
